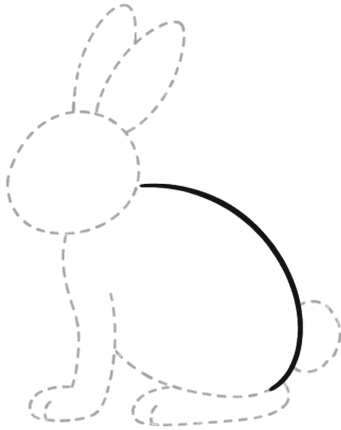


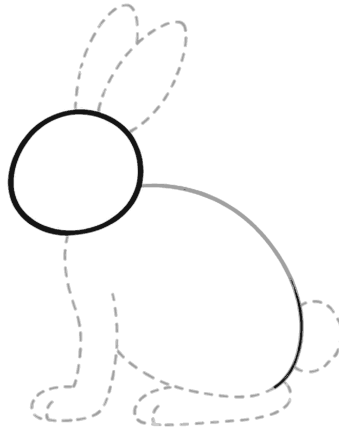
How to Draw a Rabbit

You need: a pencil, an eraser, black pen or dark pencil, plain paper

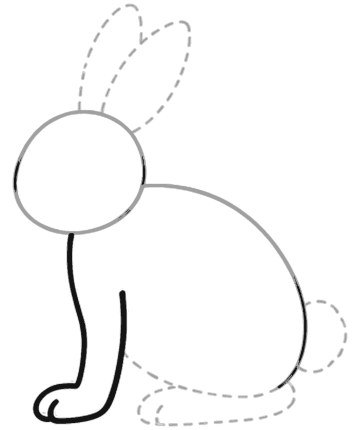
1. Draw the curved back



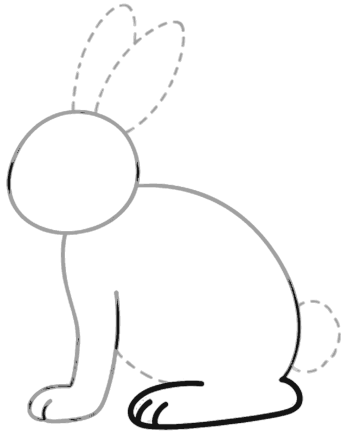
2. Add the round head



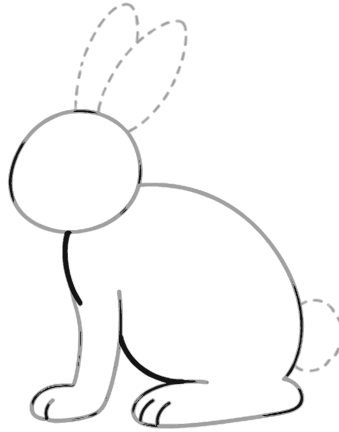
3. Draw the front leg



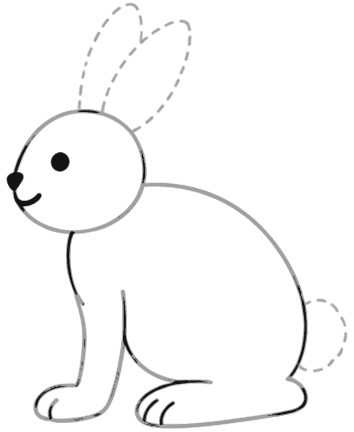
4. Draw the back foot



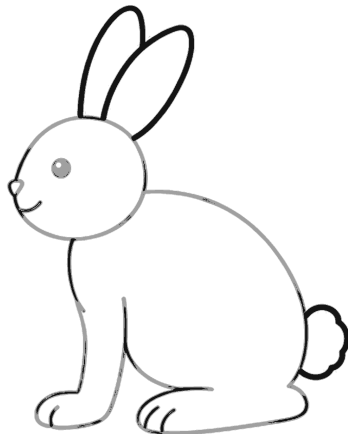
5. Join the body lines



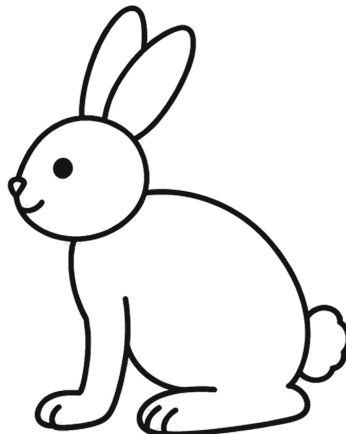
6. Add the face



7. Draw ears and tail



8. Trace and rub out guides



How to Draw a Rabbit

1. Draw the curved back

Draw one long curved line from the neck area down and around to the rabbit's back end. It follows the outside edge of the big body guide shape.

2. Add the round head

Draw a round head shape on the left, attached to the front of the back line. Follow the head guide circle all the way around.

3. Draw the front leg

Draw the front leg dropping down from the head, then curve into the front paw and back up for the inner leg line. Add two short curved toe lines on the paw.

4. Draw the back foot

Draw the large back foot near the bottom right. Make it long and rounded, with a bump at the heel and two short toe lines at the front.

5. Join the body lines

Draw a short curved chest line under the head. Then add the belly curve that runs back to the top of the back foot.

6. Add the face

Draw a small nose at the front of the head, a curved mouth line under it, and a round eye in the middle of the face. Fill in the eye and nose, leaving the tiny white shine spots shown.

7. Draw ears and tail

Draw the two long ears on top of the head, using the guide shapes. Then add the fluffy tail at the back with a bumpy cloud-like outline.

8. Trace and rub out guides

Go over all the lines you are keeping with a darker pencil or pen. Rub out the pale dotted guide shapes so the finished rabbit looks clean and clear.

Tips

- Keep the guide shapes light so they are easy to rub out later.
- Make the back foot bigger than the front paw so the rabbit looks balanced.
- If a line looks wobbly, draw it again with one slow smooth curve.
